
Management Report 2024





The International Observatory on Participatory Democracy (OIDP) is an international network open to all cities, organizations and research centers interested in learning, exchanging and applying experiences of participatory democracy at the local level. It was created in 2001 in the framework of the decentralized cooperation projects of the URB-AL program of the European Commission, and was officially constituted in November of the same year in Barcelona, at the first OIDP Conference. Since 2006, it has also been working jointly with United Cities and Local Governments (UCLG) as a mechanism for consultation on local democracy.



In 2024, the OIDP reaffirmed its mission as an international network for the exchange of good practices and consolidated its role as a consultative mechanism on local democracy within UCLG. In a context of increasing democratic challenges, the OIDP remains committed to being a dynamic space where its members can share the challenges they face and strategies to address them effectively, thus responding to the current needs of local communities. Today more than ever, the network is at the service of UCLG and the global ecosystem of municipalism, democracy and the defense of human rights.

The OIDP Technical Secretariat plays a key role in the coordination, dynamization and facilitation of the network. Its functions include keeping members informed, encouraging their active participation in the collective construction of this space and strengthening the adhesion of new members. To this end, it manages strategic communication and the maintenance of information channels, updates the membership database and promotes face-to-face and online peer-to-peer learning activities, in addition to promoting the international visibility of its members' local projects.

One of the most important annual processes of the network is the organization of its international conference, which is coordinated and facilitated by the Secretariat and the relationship between the host city and the Steering Committee. Likewise, to ensure that the network and the annual conference remain aligned with global debates on local democracy, the Secretariat coordinates the relationship with the Advisory Committee and relevant partners.

Another fundamental pillar of the OIDP's work is the identification, systematization, publication and dissemination of good practices in the field of local and regional government. In this sense, the OIDP Award "Best Practice in Citizen Participation" represents a key process within the network. The Technical Secretariat is responsible for launching the call for applications, managing the nominations and coordinating the evaluation jury.

18th OIDP Award "Best Practice in Citizen Participation"









23rd Annual International Conference in Valongo



Over 350 participants from 43 countries gathered in Valongo from October 17th to October 19th for the 23rd Annual Conference of the International Observatory of Participatory Democracy (OIDP), organized with the support of the OIDP Technical Secretariat, UCLG and the municipality of Valongo. With the theme "Populist Threats: Building Democratic Resilience with Participatory Communities", the three-day event brought together local and regional government representatives, civil society leaders and experts to explore how local participatory democracy can meet the challenges of rising populism and safeguard the future of democratic governance. The conference was inaugurated with an opening session at the Fábrica do Carvalho, where our President José Manuel Ribeiro, Mayor of Valongo, welcomed the participants and emphasized the importance of the event: "This is a crucial moment for our municipalist movement. Let's celebrate the best practices to strengthen democracy through participation!"

Emilia Saiz, Secretary General of United Cities and Local Governments (UCLG), shared these sentiments, highlighting the role of our Conference in reshaping democratic processes globally: "From UCLG and OIDP, we are committed to creating tools and actions that bring democratic learning and resilience into the global conversation. What happens in places like Valongo impacts multilateralism and the world."

The keynote speaker, Cas Mudde, an expert in populism, emphasized the critical role of local communities in rebuilding democratic trust. "It is at the local level, where people are in non-political environments, that trust can be rebuilt," he said, stressing the importance of local engagement in strengthening democracy.

The conference featured 39 different sessions, including panels, workshops, and other activities co-organized by OIDP, UCLG, and other partners and collaborators. These spaces showcased inspiring participatory democracy initiatives from cities in Latin America, Africa, Asia, and Europe, providing practical examples of how participatory mechanisms can counter authoritarianism and ensure citizen participation in decision-making.

The second day hosted the ceremony for the 18th OIDP Award for "Best Practice in Citizen Participation." The prize was awarded to Iztapalapa for its exemplary work in local public service delivery and its care for UTOPÍAS - Units of Transformation and Organization for Inclusion and Social Harmony. Additionally, seven special mentions were given to cities such as Quezon, Bohicon, and Valle del Cauca for their initiatives in gender equality, climate change, and public services.

On the third day, the Assembly of Local and Regional Leaders and Looking Toward the Future took place, moderated by Emilia Saiz, to discuss the state of democracy at the local level, the role of local governments in promoting and strengthening democracy, and what is needed from the multilateral system to achieve this. Our Secretary General Lluis Rabell, Councilor of Barcelona, emphasized the importance of OIDP and UCLG as global networks to drive world solidarity.

Finally, during the closing ceremony, we announced Krakow as the host city for our 25th Conference in 2026. Emilia Saiz expressed her gratitude to the Mayor of Valongo and the local team for hosting our Conference: "Valongo is now on the map of our global municipalist movement." At the conclusion of the 23rd edition of the Conference, Juan Domingo Viola, Secretary of Citizen Participation and Youth of Córdoba (Argentina), invited participants to the next edition in his city.

18th OIDP Award "Best Practice in Citizen Participation"



This edition of the award set a record with 47 countries of origin, from which local and regional governments shared 127 practices of participatory local democracy. More than just a number, this is a testament to the rich diversity, innovation, and determination of our municipalist movement to move toward a happier and more equitable future, built from the dreams, needs, and aspirations of local communities.

This year, to facilitate the application process for membership, the OIDP Technical Secretariat introduced an online application form on the OIDP website, available in all four working languages. The Secretariat was responsible for designing the form and reviewing it to make the instructions as clear as possible. Additionally, an application guide and graphic materials were created to support the process.

The Secretariat was also in charge of the communication strategy and the dissemination of the call on social media and in monthly newsletters. Social media posts were made, and graphic materials were designed. Likewise, a direct dissemination strategy was carried out with contacts to amplify the call.

Once the call was closed, the Secretariat took charge of translating and uploading the summaries of the applications to the ParticipateOIDP platform for open voting. The work of the jury was then coordinated, which included a virtual meeting and several deliberation sessions. Finally, the winners were contacted to confirm their participation in the conference and the awards ceremony. The trophy and diplomas were prepared, along with the digital publication compiling the 127 submitted practices in three languages: English, French, and Spanish.

The jury decided to hand the 18th OIDP Award to the Iztapalapa City Hall for their practice "UTOPÍAS – Units of Transformation and Organization for Inclusion and Social Harmony," a megainfrastructure developed and maintained through community participation, bringing public services closer to the two million residents of this peripheral municipality of Mexico City.

6. Most Supported Community Practice by OIDP: Valle del Cauca (Colombia): "Integrated Social Management System - SIGESI eGov."

7. "Sustainable Participatory Practices for Ecological Transition," in collaboration with the Phoenix Project: Quezon City Government (Philippines): "Let's Go QC, Let's Grow QC!"





Preparation of the call for applications for the **18th OIDP Award**

Throughout January 2024, the OIDP Technical Secretariat was responsible for preparing the call for applications for the 18th OIDP Award. As a novelty for this edition, the Secretariat provided an online application format on our website, available in Spanish, French, English, and Portuguese. This innovation was introduced in response to the membership's need for a more intuitive tool to submit their applications. To support the application process, the Secretariat also prepared an application guide.

In addition, in line with the key agendas of UCLG and the OIDP membership, the Secretariat proposed five categories to classify and evaluate the practices:

- 1) Building more democratic and peaceful cities and territories
- 2) Urban planning and public space
- 3) Gender and care
- 4) Ecological transition and the environment
- 5) Civic technology and Artificial Intelligence

GOLD Global Report

As part of the OIDP's academic collaboration activities, the Technical Secretariat kicked off the collaborative study for the 7th GOLD Global Report - Local Democracy and Decentralization "Economies of Equality and Care": "Local Democratic Innovations Expanding the Notion of Assistance: Participatory Budgets as Facilitators of Care-Based Local Economic Development," which will be released in the second quarter of 2025.

This study takes as case studies some of the candidate practices from the 2022 and 2023 editions of the OIDP Award. The project is being carried out in collaboration with Yves Cabannes, Emeritus Professor of Development Planning at University College London and a long-time collaborator of the OIDP.

The Secretariat has been responsible for contacting the 44 local and regional governments (20 from 2022 and 24 from 2023) that were selected from a joint review and analysis conducted with the academic.

This study exemplifies the core mission of the OIDP and the OIDP Award: nurturing the global ecosystem of participatory democracy through local practices. In this sense, the OIDP Award fulfills its role as more than just a recognition: it is the starting point for a multitude of networking initiatives between local and regional governments.





This online event aimed to safeguard the SDG indicator 11.3.2: "Proportion of cities with a structure for direct civil society participation in urban planning and management that operates regularly and democratically." This indicator was at risk of being removed from the Global SDG Database due to insufficient participation from governments at all levels in providing relevant data. In response to this situation, the OIDP, UCLG, and GTF joined the call from Our City Plans and UN-HABITAT to strengthen the participation of networks and local and regional governments in this process.

15 The OIDP launches the call for the 19th OIDP Award

The OIDP Technical Secretariat led the launch of the call for the 19th OIDP Award. Based on feedback received from participants in previous editions, the OIDP conducted an evaluation and improvement of the application process to ensure a smoother experience for local and regional governments, as well as participating organizations. Various materials were prepared, such as the online application form, the call for proposals guidelines, the application guide, and the official OIDP Award website.

As a new feature in this edition, the OIDP introduced a special mention for the durability and sustainability of the practice. This change allowed for the nomination of practices that, although no longer active in 2024, have remained in effect for more than five years, maintaining their name and characteristics without significant changes.

The call was supported by a comprehensive communication strategy, which included everything from the creation of graphics to guide the application process, to the design of

communication kits so that the UCLG ecosystem and OIDP partners could spread the call through their own channels. As a result, 137 applications were received from 108 local governments by the closing of the call on January 31, 2025.




Website and social media
