Facing the Challenges of Informal Settlements

BACKGROUND

Informal settlements are at the heart of the urbanization challenge, home to millions who face precarious living conditions, limited access to services, and systemic exclusion from decision-making processes. Traditional governance approaches have often failed to recognize the agency of communities living in informality, leading to top-down policies that do not reflect their needs or realities. In response, a **care-centered approach** to governance is emerging—one that prioritizes **participation**, **co-responsibility, and the recognition of informal communities as key actors in urban transformation**.

This session explores how local governments can govern with care, ensuring that informal settlement residents are not merely beneficiaries of policies but active co-creators of solutions. It builds on the understanding that **participatory governance is not only about consultation but about creating sustained mechanisms for decision-making, resource allocation, and accountability**. It also acknowledges the











political challenges that local leaders face in balancing short-term governance cycles with the long-term structural changes required for inclusion.

At the same time, technical expertise plays a crucial role in translating political commitments into actionable strategies. Rights-based legal frameworks, innovative urban planning tools, and evidence-based policy approaches can help cities institutionalize participation, ensure land tenure security, and integrate informal settlements into the urban fabric without displacing communities. This requires an intersectional lens that considers gender, human rights, economic inequalities, and environmental vulnerabilities, ensuring that policies truly respond to the lived experiences of those in informality. Moreover, care-centered approaches to governance must be linked to human rights, as addressing informality through human rights-based approaches is key to achieving **social inclusion**. This ensures that policies not only support basic needs but also protect the dignity and rights of marginalized communities, fostering long-term empowerment and equality.

By bringing together political and technical perspectives, this session seeks to bridge the gap between commitment and implementation, offering a space for dialogue on how participatory governance can be scaled, funded, and sustained in the face of rapid urbanization and climate change. It will highlight experiences from different regions, showcasing what works, what barriers remain, and how a care-centered governance model can reshape urban futures.

OBJECTIVES

This session aims to build collective knowledge on participatory governance in informal settlements by bringing together local leaders and technical experts to exchange experiences, challenges, and innovative approaches. It seeks to foster trust between policymakers, practitioners, and community representatives, emphasizing the importance of co-creation in addressing informality. By sparking new ideas, the discussion will explore how a care-centered approach to governance can lead to more inclusive, rights-based urban policies. Additionally, the session will take stock of current practices, identifying what is working, what barriers remain, and how these can be overcome through institutional and technical innovations. Finally, insights from this exchange will inform the writing of an academic article (Urbanisation Journal) on participatory governance in informal settlements.

METHODOLOGY

This 90-minute presentation panel will feature two rounds of dynamic discussion, bringing together eight panelists-four political leaders and four technical experts-to explore solutions at the intersection of policy and practice. The **first round** will focus on high-level political perspectives, where political panelists will outline their priorities and













visions. The **second round** will shift to a technical exchange, with experts responding to political statements by providing data-driven insights, innovative approaches, and implementation strategies. An interactive Q&A session will follow, encouraging engagement from the audience.
